

**Public Safety & Justice** 

#### **Tulalip Police Department Monthly Report:**

• Chief Sutter provides an overview of monthly statistics. Property Crimes are going in the right direction, we still have issues with theft, but that is typical when you have a nice shopping district. Traffic incidents are low, considering the amount of traffic that moves through the Village. TPD officers are trained to do DUI's and do not have to call Snohomish County. The police department is hosting an event called, National Night Out. It will be held at the Tulalip Amphitheater on August 2, 2022. This is a community outreach event to meet and greet with the public. The Tulalip Police Department was invited to participate at the First Nation's Conference. It will be 574 tribes and they chose Tulalip as their model.

#### Finance

- Motion made to adopt Resolution 2022-27 approving the close of the Quil Ceda Village Parking Lot Expansion Project and transfer of funds in the amount of \$228,183.48 to the New Administration Building project.
- Motion made to adopt Resolution 2022-28 the transfer of \$3,263,054 from the tax bank account to the QCV main operating account to cover the 3rd Quarter operating budget for the departments listed above.
- Motion made to adopt Resolution 2022-29 approving the close of the Quil Ceda Village Capital Projects and the transfer of funds in the amount of \$210,347 to the New Administration Building project.
- Motion made to adopt Resolution 2022-30 hereby formally approving the termination of the Commercial Lease Agreement as of February 5, 2020 and the cancellation of indebtedness related to the Lease in the amount of \$5,348.59.
- Motion made to adopt Resolution 2022-31 approving the rescission of Resolution 2022-16 which will rescind the appropriation and use of the Cigarette Tax funds held at Quil Ceda Village as a funding source for a portion of the 2022 Funding Agreement for Tulalip Bay Fire District.
- Motion made to adopt Resolution 2022-32 ratifying the transfer of funds in the amount of \$26,626.57 from the QPARK project to the New Pumps project to cover the final expenses and closing out the project.

**Public Safety & Justice** 

#### Marysville Fire District Monthly Report:

 During the month of May, the Marysville Fire responded to the Village 47 times and are on pace to respond to 1,500 calls for the year. Deputy Chief Maloney thanks the Council for the removal of a barn. Marysville Fire does not typically coordinate with Tulalip Boom City unless asked.

#### **Tulalip Police Department Monthly Report:**

· During the month of May the service calls are below average. There is an increase in shoplifting with the increased amount of shoppers moving through the Seattle Premium Outlets. Groups enter SPO and grab and dash, so to get those numbers down we will increase staffing in that area. We had an increase in motor vehicle accidents and a stolen vehicle was abandoned on the side of the road. Chief Sutter updates the Council about their planned event called, National Night Out. It will be held at the Tulalip Amphitheatre in August. Chief Sutter explains the purpose of the event is community engagement, getting our community members and police officers to interact and get to know each other. Chief Sutter explains that Tulalip Police will maintain a presence at Boom City, and further explains that it is a precautionary measure to ensure officers can respond quickly should the need arise.

#### **Finance**

 Mark Sabo explains the cigarette tax is down at 38%, and should be at 42%. Cannabis is down from projections. Fuel tax is slightly above budget at 44%. Hotel tax is down at 32%. The budget is created by analyzing our sales and the market, so it's not a flat rate formula. This is a Government

 report and is different than a business budget. We do not budget for any interest or income loss or gain and do have a market loss, year to date, for securities at QCV. On the expense side of things we are well under 42%, and public safety has not been expensed yet but will be on budget once complete.

#### **Public Safety & Justice**

 Daryl Neuhoff introduces himself to the Quil Ceda Village Council as Acting Fire Chief for the foreseeable future.
 During the month of June Marysville Fire responded to 41 incidents in Quil Ceda Village. 37 of those calls were EMS related and there have been 228 calls for service to date.
 There was one minor injury at Boom City, but no medical transportation was required, and one minor brush fire.

#### **Tulalip Police Department Monthly Report:**

 During the month of June, there has been a decrease in activity at Quil Ceda Village. Chief Sutter states that he would like to verify the monthly statistics report to verify that the activity numbers are accurate. Tulalip Police made sixty (60) arrests in the area and is maintaining an active presence within the Village. There was one crime against persons, shoplifting decreased to four (4) incidents.

#### **Finance**

 The monthly finance report, through June, shows the cigarette tax is down at 3.6 million for the year, fuel tax is up slightly based on gallons sold, and the Hotel & Occupancy is below at 45%. We did pay the first half of the Public Safety payments.
